



This includes Rotarians who joined Rotary or transferred from another club during the current Rotary year. However their contributions will be used for per capita calculations.

- A. Indicates 100% Paul Harris Fellow Club and the date this was achieved.
- B. District and club number appear on the top left
- C. Number of club's Paul Harris Fellows and Benefactors
- D. Number of Bequest Society Members and Major Donors
- E. Number of Rotarian Donors and Rotarian Non-Donors
- F. Number of Rotary Direct Donors and Non-Rotarian Donors
- G. Total historical contributions to The Rotary Foundation credited to the club. Includes all contribution types (Annual Fund, Endowment Fund and Other Giving (which includes PolioPlus Fund and grants)
- H. Identifying information by individual, including member ID (+ indicates deceased member), name, and membership status (Y = active member; N = former/deceased member or non-Rotarian with a contribution history; H = honorary member)
- I. Recognition amount reflects the total Paul Harris Fellow recognition you have accumulated through your personal contributions plus all recognition points you've been given by other individuals, clubs, or districts. Recognition points given to you don't count toward Major Donor recognition. The maximum amount that can be shown on the Club Recognition Summary report is 9,000; the "+" sign indicates that the actual amount exceeds the 9,000-point maximum.
- J. Paul Harris Fellow/Multiple PHF status, and month and year first PHF recognition was achieved
- K. Foundation Recognition Pts Available reflect points you have accumulated through personal outright giving to the Foundation. All points listed can be transferred to other individuals for Paul Harris Fellow recognition
- L. Foundation recognition points available, which can be transferred to other individuals to help them achieve their first or multiple PHF recognition. Points accumulate 1:1 for every dollar contributed *Learn about Foundation recognition points on page 9.
- M. Month & year along with the designation (program fund) of most recent contribution
- N. Indicates Benefactor status. A Benefactor is anyone who informs The Rotary Foundation in writing that s/he has made provisions in their will, or other estate plan, naming the Endowment Fund as a beneficiary; or anyone who makes an outright gift of \$1,000 or more to the Endowment Fund.
- Rotary Direct status indicated (Y= Rotary Direct participant)







- •Bulbar ~ 2%
















END POLIO NOW CAMPAIGN



- > 1985 POLIO PLUS CAMPAIGN LAUNCHED
- > 2007 GATES FOUNDATION GAVE TRF A \$100 MILLION CHALLENGE GRANT FOR POLIO ERADICATION
- > 2009 GATES INCREASED INITIAL GRANT TO \$355 MILLION
- > 2013 GATES MATCH CHALLENGE: TWO-FOR ONE, UP TO \$35 MILLION PER YEAR THROUGH 2018
- > ROTARY HAS RAISED 1.5 BILLION DOLLARS FOR POLIO
- POLIO ERADICATION FOR 2016-2018 = \$3.5 BILLION


World Wild Polio cases in 2015: 74

AS OF AUGUST 4, 2016= 19






